
Harold's Report.



Boneseed was present but not much of a problem yet, and easy to pull up. There was a fair bit of smilax too but we lacked the means to dig out its massive roots - another time perhaps. We found some ivy, and another elegant foreigner(?) we couldn't identify but which we'll probably have to chop out later. Afternoon tea without a visiting specialist was a pleasant resting time after our strenuous work. Many thanks to those who brought things to eat, and welcome to Don and Leonie Hatton, who attended for the first time.


When Where & What to Bring!

If Friends ever wonder where the plants for planting days come from the next working bee will answer the question. We will be potting up plants at the Pound Bend nursery at the depot. The nursery assures a supply of indigenous plants for the Park. Rangers collect seed throughout the year and this is propagated in the greenhouse. The seedlings are then potted on and grown in the shade houses to be planted out by groups during the year. Because the plants are of local stock they fit in and grow well; It is possible too to grow all kinds of plants from grasses to eucalypts and this makes the nursery work particularly valuable. So come along and help in this work. There will also be a speaker from the Entomological Society - this should be most interesting.






