Dear Fowspian Friends,

This personal letter will probably be the last formal communication from Margaret and Ian Burke. Many of you may ask "what has happened to FOWSP?" and "why has Margaret Burke resigned as leader of the Friends of the Park?" Well, I can hardly believe this myself! I have had such great friendship and reward from working with you, it seems right that I should say something about these recent stressful times. Ian has joined me in preparing this note.

Over the past few months I have found myself having to try to understand a number of problems that have been unusual for me as co-ordinator. Most of these have been what is known in personnel management circles as 'people problems' and I have been trying to solve these in ways I always did in the past. I tried to solve the problems myself, wishing to avoid involving the membership in this sort of uncomfortable, possibly damaging, activity. I will no doubt reflect on these events and how I handled them now I'm freed from the anguish of the past months. Yet for my trouble I have been forced out. I grieve at this end to eight years of very active involvement.


Several people, including some committee members have found my difficulty at 'getting on' with the Head Ranger unacceptable; have felt that 'getting on' with him should have been a prime consideration and responsibility. This simplistic approach completely ignores personal integrity and other ethical considerations - the very things that helped the group grow and prosper over more than eight years.

I remain comfortable about each of the decisions I made. I think we have succeeded as a group which actually gets things done, (better than anyone expects us to!) involving the wide spectrum of community. A rather gentle lobby force achieving miracles! Of course, this can only happen if the group maintains a high level of independence in principle and in practice. My view is that direct action takes too much energy which can be more productively used achieving task oriented goals. It seems to me that consultation and compromise usually offer better solutions than confrontation. There is little doubt that these days the group is held in high esteem both by authorities and the general community.

'Friends' groups are about people - I hope this remains the continuing emphasis of the group, for to lose this concept could only herald disaster. But times and people change and we go on. Ian and I are going on to new and fulfilling roles and ventures. If a new direction for the Friends seems inevitable...so be it. To all my Friends of Warrandyte State Park I extend my regards and very best wishes for the future.

So dear Fowspians, thank you from Ian and myself..... for all the good times. Our friend Elbert Hubbard should have the final word.
